V.C.'s Message...



The Dravidian University, unlike its counterparts in the state, was founded primarily to conduct international level advanced research in the areas of Dravidian Culture, Folk and Tribal Lore, History, Archaeology, Literature and Philosophy in a comparative and holistic approach with the objective of realizing the true spirit of national integration.

There are about 27 languages with different sub-groups and sects, so far enumerated as belonging to Dravidian languages. Only four of them are well developed with scripts and historical legacies. Among the rest, Tulu, has considerable socio-economic advancement. The rest of the languages do not have a written tradition, though they have a rich oral tradition. Socially and economically, theirs are highly backward societies. They are often categorized as 'tribes', some of them as 'primitive tribes', far away from the modern developments in scientific, technological and socio-economic areas.

Therefore, there is a great historic need and responsibility for the entire nation to equip them with necessary educational tools at all levels and offer modern perspectives of life affecting their socio-economic advancement on par with the other citizens of the nation at the same time duly preserving their cultural identity, in other words - our cultural roots. The richness of their knowledge and wealth of wisdom, which stand above all scripts and tongues, forming part of the glittering glory of the nation, have to be revitalized. In order to fulfill such cherished objectives, the Dravidian University was established. The main objectives of the University are:

- To conduct International level advanced Research in the areas of Dravidian Culture, Folklore, History, Archaeology, Literature and Philosophy with Comparative and holistic approach.
- To work for an integrated development of Dravidian Languages, both written and spoken, including the Tribal languages of the Dravidian family.
- To advance and disseminate learning and knowledge in and on Dravidian languages, literature, culture and traditional technology through diverse means of modern learning technologies.
- To take up extension activities with an emphasis on rural development.

- To encourage research inside and outside the country in and on Dravidian studies.
- To translate books of Dravidian languages into other languages and also to translate books from other languages into Dravidian languages.
- To develop Dravidian Languages as vehicles of modern knowledge systems.

Though the principal objectives are the above, the University had to serve the adjoining rural areas with courses which had Job potential. Courses in Computer Sciences, Management, Education and Telugu Pandit Training were started to begin with. Today the number has grown to include all subjects and the University has strengthened infrastructural facilities to impart quality education.

It shall be my endeavor to create proper academic atmosphere for the healthy growth of students.

About the University

The Dravidian University was established by the Government of Andhra Pradesh through a Legislature Act (No.17 of 1997) at Kuppam, a tri-lingual junction in the south-western part of Andhra Pradesh with the initial support extended by the governments of Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Kerala for an integrated development of Dravidian languages, literatures thus paving way for cultural and emotional integration of all the regions that carry forward the ancient historical torch of the nation.

The University, which formally came into existence in 1997, began functioning with two departments in 1998, has today grown into a strong institution of 21 Academic Departments and 7 Research Centres.

Located in a sylvan scene, pollution-free and aesthetically appealing, Srinivasavanam, the campus, presents a traditional picture of a *Gurukulam* in 21st Century, blending tradition and modernity harmoniously.

Reservation of Seats for Other Southern States

Re-allotment of seats in case of vacancy in other categories

- The open category seats will be filled up with General Merit students.
- The SC category seats will be filled up with SC category students.
 - If SC (W) seat is vacant and not filled up it will be filled by ST (W) only
 - If no ST (W) Candidate is available, it will be filled by SC /ST Merit Quota.
 - If there is no candidate in SC category, it will go to ST category and vice – versa.
 - If there is no SC/ST category (if the list is exhausted) it will be converted into Open Category (OC).
- Any vacant seat within BC category will be filled up by other BC candidates.
 - If BC (W) seat is vacant in any category, it will be filled up by other BC (W) categories.
 - If there is no BC (W) candidates, it will be filled up by BC (Merit) candidates.
 - If the total BC list (in all categories) is exhausted, then the remaining seats will be converted into Open Category.

N.B: The total seats for the M.Ed. Course are 25 (inclusive of other state quotas of 6 seats, i.e., 2 seats each for Karnataka, Tamilnadu and Kerala. If in any case, any such seats are not filled in, such seats shall be realotted to the common pool as per reservation.

Under Games & Sports Category, participation in the following games and sports only shall be considered as certified by recognized bodies or associations: Cricket, Foot ball, Hockey, Volley Ball, Basket Ball, Tennis, Kabadi, Shuttle-Badminton, Ball-Badminton, Table Tennis, Athletics, Swimming, Weight Lifting, Wrestling, Boxing, Gymnastics, Kho-Kho, Hand Ball, Chess, Cycling, Rowing, Body Building and Shooting. Candidate shall have to produce the following documents

- i) Certificates issued by a recognized Sports Body or Association.
- ii) Group photos or paper cuttings, if any as a proof of participation of the candidate in the sports or games events.

ECA general merit list will be prepared with candidates of Priority I arranged in the order of DUCET rank followed by candidates of Priority II arranged in the order of DUCET rank followed by candidates of Priority III arranged in the order of DUCET rank.

- iii) When there is only one ECA seat in a course, it will be filled as per the order in the ECA general merit list.
- iv) When there are two ECA seats, the first seat will be filled as per the order in the ECA general merit list. The second seat will be filled from the ECA general merit list by a candidate belonging to the category other than the category of the first candidate selected ensuring women reservation.
- v) When there are three ECA seats, one seat is earmarked for each category. The first seat will be filled as per the order in the ECA general merit list. The second seat will be filled from ECA general merit list by a candidate not belonging to the category of the first candidate selected. The third seat will be filled from the ECA general merit list by a candidate belonging to the remaining category ensuring women reservation. The left-over ECA Seats will go to Open Category.

Physically Handicapped (PH) Category

- i. PH candidates should enclose the attested copy of the certificate issued by the Medical Board of District Headquarters Hospital or General Hospital of a Medical College. The Certificate should indicate the nature and extent of disability in percentage.
- ii. At the time of interview, a physically handicapped candidate must submit the original PH certificate and appear before the Doctor of Dravidian University. Admission will be made on the basis of the percentage of disability as assessed by the University Doctor, but not according to the rank in the entrance test. Where handicap is equal, merit in the entrance test will be taken into consideration for admission. A physically handicapped candidate will not be admitted into a course if the handicap does not allow him to pursue the course to a reasonable extent. If there is no suitable candidate under PH category, the seat will be filled with a candidate of local open category.

Children of the Armed Personnel (CAP) seats

The following priorities shall be drawn up with regard to the Children of Armed Personnel.

- i) Children of Servicemen killed in action.
- ii) Children of Ex-Servicemen disabled in action and permanently incapacitated as a result thereof in respect of disability pension.
- iii) Children of Ex-Servicemen and Servicemen who have received Gallantry Awards in the following order. (a) Param Vir Chakra; (b) Ashok Chakra; (c) Mahavir Chakra; (d) Kirti Chakra; (e) Vir Chakra; (f) Shaurya Chakra; (g) Sena/Nao Sena/Vayu Sena Medal; (h) Mention in dispatches.
- iv) Children of Armed Personnel (combatant) irrespective of the rank held by them.
- v) Children of other Ex-Servicemen or Servicemen who are eligible for pension.

If there is more than one candidate in any of the above groups, priority will be decided on the basis of DUCET-2010 rank.

Reservation for women: One third of the seats are reserved for women candidates in each category (i.e., OC, SC, ST, BC, ECA, PH and L/NL). This rule is not applied if women candidates selected on merit in a category form one third or more of the seats therein. If there are no suitable women candidates in a category, the seats will be filled with men candidates of the same category. Absence of adequate number of women candidates in a category cannot be compensated by giving more seats for women in another category.

Refund of Fee

1. Registration fee once paid will not be refunded or readjusted to any other programme. Full tuition fee will be refunded if any student cancels his/ her seat before the closure of admission schedule.
2. If the student cancels his/her admission after the commencement of classes, 50% of tuition fee only will be refunded irrespective of whether the student has attended any class or not.
3. For such refunds the students can approach the Dean and submit the requisition letter for refund.

Hostel Accommodation

1. There are separate Hostels for Boys and Girls on the Dravidian University Campus.
2. All the students hailing from more than 20 KM radius of Dravidian University are eligible for Hostel Accommodation. However, admission will be given depending upon the distance of their hometown and based on the availability of accommodation.
