

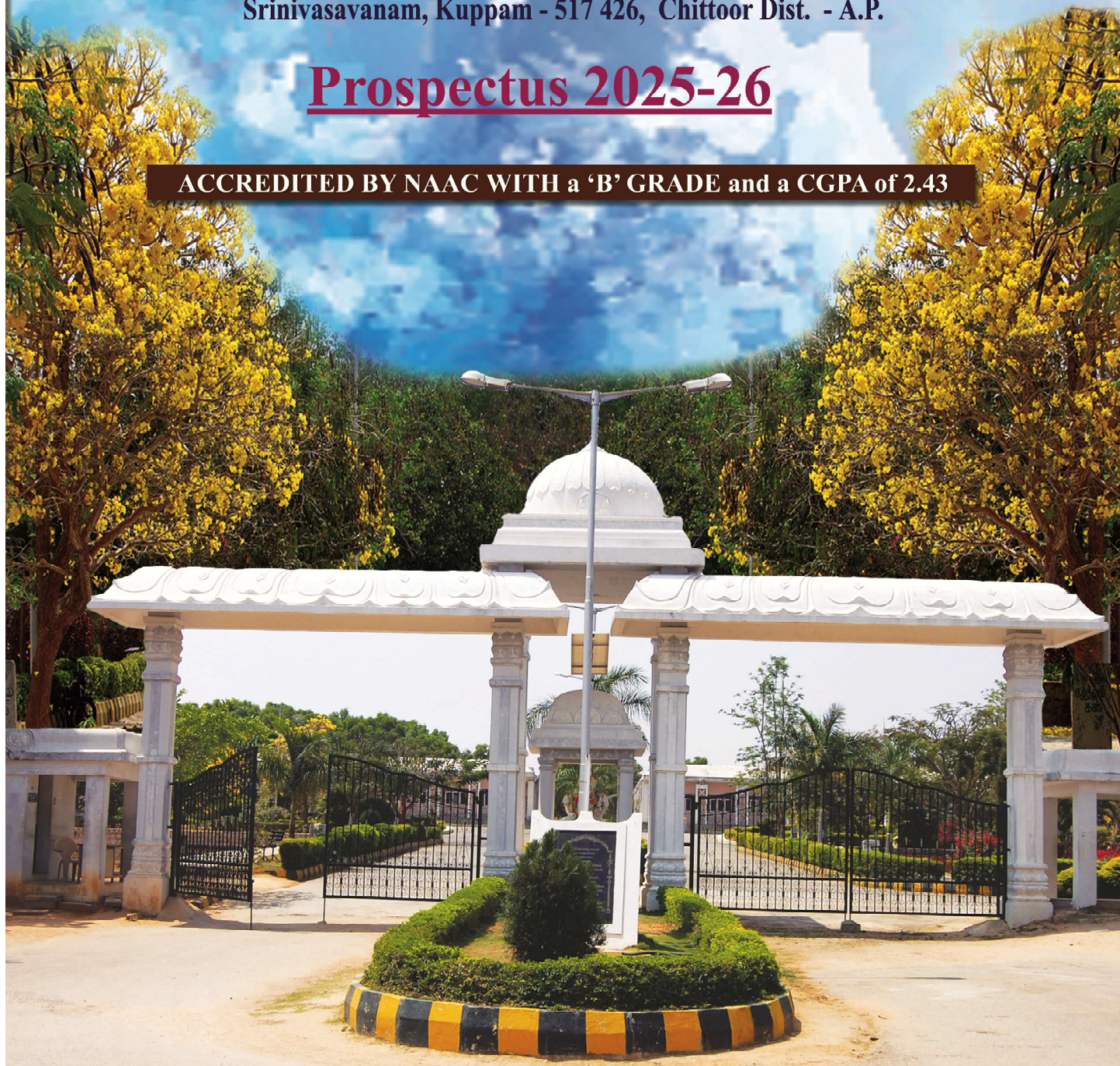

The University

The Dravidian University was established by the Government of Andhra Pradesh through a Legislature Act (No. 17 of 1997) at Kuppam, a tri-lingual junction in the south-western part of Andhra Pradesh. It was set up with initial support extended by the Governments of Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, and Kerala for an integrated development of Dravidian Languages and Literatures, thus paving the way for cultural and emotional integration of all the regions that carry forward the ancient historical torch of the nation.

The University is an inter-state institution integrated with traditional knowledge systems and modern scientific approaches. It is very close to different places like Krishnagiri, Hosur, Salem, Vellore, and Chennai of Tamil Nadu State; KGF, Bangarpet, Kolar, and Bengaluru of Karnataka State; and Palamaneru, Punganur, Madanapalle, Chittoor, and Tirupati of Andhra Pradesh. It is well connected by road, rail, and air.

The University, which came into existence in 1997 with two departments in 1999, has today grown into a strong institution with 20 academic departments and 4 centers. Located in Srinivasavanam, the campus presents a picture of a unique blend of tradition and harmony with sylvan surroundings-pollution-free and aesthetically appealing.

The Emblem



The emblem of Dravidian University is designed to indicate the main objectives and ideals of the university. The *open book* symbolizes *knowledge accessible to all*. The popular maxim *Knowledge is Power*, found at the top of the open book, indicates the supreme place given to knowledge. The basic aim of the university being the promotion of knowledge, the university has chosen this maxim as its motto.

Lotus is a symbol representing the seat of learning and prosperity, and the blossomed lotus symbolizes various facets of knowledge to which the university contributes. The *lighted lamp with four wicks* is indicative of the destruction of ignorance and the emergence of brightness and liveliness from all sides, paving the way for learning and progress. The word *Dravida* in the scripts of the four major Dravidian languages is a unifying interpretation of the coalescence of Dravidian culture.

MODE OF ADMISSION:

For all **Postgraduate (PG) Programmes**, the admissions will be made **as per merit in the entrance examination**, as per the following:

MA, MSc & M.Com: APPGCET, B.Ed.: Ed CET, MCA/MBA: ICET, B.P.Ed.: PECET.

Note: There is no Entrance test for UG (OAMDC Portal (Online), and also for M.A.(Kannada) and M.A. (Tamil) Programmes.

The following eligibility criteria may please be noted carefully while admitting the UG students into various courses of study:

- (a) For admission into B.Sc. (Hons) Computer Science and allied courses, candidates should have studied Mathematics at the qualifying examination.
- (b) For admission into B.Sc. Degree Course with Biology / Zoology / Biochemistry / Sericulture / Chemistry / Microbiology / Biotechnology as one of the subjects under Part-II, candidates should have passed Biology, Physics, and Chemistry in the qualifying examination.
- (c) For admission into B.Com. Degree Course, priority should be given to students who passed Commerce/Arts subjects in the qualifying examination, though all candidates are eligible.
- (d) For admission into B.A. Degree Course, priority should be given to students who passed Arts subjects in the qualifying examination, though all candidates are eligible.
- (e) For admission into BBA Degree Course, priority should be given to students who passed Commerce subject in the qualifying examination, though all candidates are eligible.

AP EAPCET - 2025 (ENGINEERING)

A Common Entrance Test designated as “Engineering, Agriculture & Pharmacy Common Entrance Test” (AP EAPCET – 2025) will be conducted by JNT University Kakinada for the academic year 2025-2026 for admission into the First Year of Professional Engineering Courses offered by the University.

The **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**, introduced by the Government of India, represents a transformative vision for the education system, with significant implications for higher education and university syllabi. Aimed at fostering holistic, flexible, and multidisciplinary learning, NEP seeks to align the Indian education system with the needs of the 21st century.

- 1. Multidisciplinary and Holistic Education:** University curricula are being restructured to allow students to explore diverse fields across sciences, arts, humanities, and vocational subjects, encouraging a well-rounded education.
- 2. Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS):** The implementation of CBCS under NEP enables students to choose subjects across disciplines and accumulate credits flexibly, promoting academic mobility.
- 3. Skill Development and Employability:** Emphasis is placed on incorporating skill-based and vocational courses to improve employability. Syllabi now often include internships, apprenticeships, and project-based learning.
- 4. Integration of Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS):** NEP encourages the inclusion of indigenous knowledge, traditions, and languages in the curriculum to promote cultural awareness and national identity.
- 5. Technology Integration:** Digital literacy, blended learning, and the use of online platforms are now embedded in teaching and learning processes, especially post-COVID.
- 6. Research and Innovation Focus:** The policy promotes undergraduate research, innovation, and critical thinking through flexible syllabi and research-driven pedagogy.
- 7. Assessment Reforms:** Assessment is being reoriented to focus more on conceptual understanding and application rather than rote memorization. Continuous and formative assessments are being encouraged.
- 8. Multiple Entry and Exit Options:** Degree programs now allow for flexible exits after one, two, or three years with corresponding certifications (certificate, diploma, or bachelor's degree).

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

All the Under Graduate/Post Graduate Programmes of the Dravidian University are offered under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS).

The structure of Post Graduate Programme consists of:

- a) Core Courses-compulsory.
- b) Skill Oriented Course.
- c) Open Online / Offline Transdisciplinary Course
- d) Indian Knowledge Systems.
- e) Skill Development Course.
- f) Add-on Courses –Open for the students from the other departments also.

1. General Rules of Attendance:

- a. The Graduate/Postgraduate degree shall be conferred on a candidate who, after getting admission into the particular Undergraduate/Postgraduate programme, has pursued a 'Regular course of study' as herein prescribed, and fulfilled the conditions laid down for attendance of students, and passed the prescribed examinations, both in theory and practical (wherever applicable).
- b. The minimum essential attendance requirement is 75% in course work. In special cases, the Vice-Chancellor may condone deficiency of attendance not exceeding 12.5% on the recommendation of the HOD/School Dean concerned, based on a medical certificate from an authorized medical officer or, in the case of natural calamities, duly certified by the Tahsildar. A monthly consolidated attendance statement will be displayed on the departmental notice board on the 5th of every month, and the same may be sent every month to the Dean, Academic Affairs.
- c. Students who are continuously absent for ten days or more will be served a notice by the Head of the Department concerned, stating that they have to forfeit their seat if they fail to report to the department immediately.
- d. Students who get less than 62.5% attendance have to re-do the course in the following year by paying the admission fee and other prescribed fees.
- e. Students who do not have adequate attendance will not be considered for the award of any scholarship or any kind of financial aid from any other Government or Quasi-Government Agency.
- f. Attendance shall be reckoned from the date of admission to the last instruction day as per the almanac.
- g. The above rules of attendance are also applicable to students who are already admitted in the previous years and are continuing their studies at present.
- h. 20% exemption of attendance to a pregnant lady student would be allowed on personal request.

2. General Rules for Examination:

- a. All Graduate/Postgraduate Examinations of the University shall be held at the Headquarters of the University at Srinivasavanam, Kuppam on such dates as notified by the Controller of Examinations, Dravidian University.
- b. Candidate who fails to present himself/herself for the examination due to any reason whatsoever, including shortage of attendance or one who fails in the examination, shall not be entitled to claim a refund of the whole or part of the examination fee, or ask for the transfer of the same for a subsequent examination or examinations.
- c. A candidate who has been allowed to appear at the examination of the University once, but has not been able to appear or has failed to pass the examination, may be permitted to appear at the same examination again without putting in any further attendance.
- d. A candidate, after he/she has been declared successful in an examination, shall be awarded a degree stating the year of the examination, the subjects in which he/she was examined, and the division/grade in which he/she was placed.
- e. No candidate shall be allowed to put in attendance for or appear at two examinations at the same time. This rule does not apply to the examination for part-time Diploma or Certificate Courses offered by the University.
- f. However, the candidate has to complete the programme within four years, and five years in special cases. Otherwise, he/she has to seek fresh admission, notwithstanding the fact that new subjects might have been introduced.
- g. Whenever a programme or scheme of examination in the University changes, one more examination in the following year shall be conducted according to the old syllabus/regulations. Candidates not availing themselves of this chance or failing at this examination shall take the examination thereafter according to the changed syllabus/regulations.
- h. Instruction in various subjects shall be provided by the Department concerned as per the scheme of instruction and syllabi prescribed.
- i. The programme of instruction, examination, and vacations shall be notified by Dravidian University.
- j. The medium of instruction shall be English.
- k. University examinations (theory/practical) shall be held as prescribed in the scheme of the examination.
- l. The course of study shall consist of class lectures, tutorials, seminars, project work, record work, etc.
- m. The University examination in the theory courses will be a written examination.

3. Rule of Progression from one Semester to the next Semester:

- A student is allowed to move from first semester to second semester and to the subsequent semesters in a sequential manner if he/she fulfills the stipulated attendance and academic requirements, besides attempting the semester-end examinations of the concerned semester. No skipping of semesters is allowed. Passing of all courses (subjects) is not compulsory for moving to the immediately next semester course-work, i.e., from first to second, second to third, third to fourth, fourth to fifth, and fifth to sixth. Such students who have failed in a few or all courses (subjects) shall be permitted to sit for semester-end examinations of that particular semester along with the subsequent batch students, till they successfully complete within the permitted maximum period, i.e., within 2 additional years in the case of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.B.A./B.Ed./B.P.Ed./M.Com./M.Sc./M.A./M.C.A./M.B.A./M.Ed./M.Lib.I.Sc.
- A student falling short of attendance, including condoning limits (ranging between 62.5% to 75%) in a particular semester shall not be permitted to apply for semester-end examinations and is detained to redo that particular semester coursework once again. Such students are not permitted to move to the immediate next semester.
- Request for readmission for redoing of semester work will be considered in the subsequent academic year only, and in the same semester in which he/she could not put up the required attendance.

4. Improvement of Division/Grade:

A candidate is permitted to appear for improvement only once, i.e., in the immediate following examination. The candidate who is desirous to improve the class/grade should appear at all the theory courses. No provision for improvement in practicals.

5. Appearance and Reappearance for the Examination:

- Candidates who have put in the required attendance, both in Theory and Practical (wherever applicable), and those who have completed practical work and submitted records specified in the curriculum alone are eligible to appear for the theory and practical examinations of a particular semester of any Graduate/Postgraduate programme. No candidate without the completion of projects and practical record work will be allowed for Semester-end theory/practical examinations.
- The HOD/School Dean shall not allow any candidate to appear for the final theory examination if their practical work, as prescribed, is not satisfactory or incomplete at the time of forwarding the application for examination to the Controller of Examinations. Such candidates should seek fresh admission or readmission in the subsequent year to complete their practical work.
- A candidate who fails in the theory part of the examination may be allowed to reappear either in the concerned theory course(s) in which he/she failed or in all the theory courses, at any subsequent examination without putting in further attendance, provided he/she does not change the subjects originally studied by him/her.

- ## 6. Disciplinary Rules:

1. To maintain dignity, decency, decorum, order, and calmness, and also to obey the instructions of the teachers in the classrooms;
2. To maintain silence in reading rooms, in the Library, and also on the campus;
3. To submit to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the authorities and obey the rules and regulations made by the University from time to time;
4. Not to form any formal or informal groups on the basis of caste, creed, community, or religion;
5. Not to sow seeds of discord among students;
6. Not to engage in any kind of activity that interrupts the corporate life of the University;
7. Not to adopt any coercive measures;
8. Not to abuse the privileges or status of students;
9. Not to go outside the place of study during the class hours;
10. Not to be in the canteen or any public place during the working hours of the College;
11. Not to smoke, drink alcohol, use prohibited drugs, and not to indulge in violence and vandalism on the campus;
12. Not to misbehave or tease any girl or boy student and commit nuisance on the campus by involving in any act of ragging;
13. Not to demand for postponement of examinations or for re-examination;
14. Not to misbehave with any staff member, examiner, invigilator, or any official of the university;
15. Not to meddle with the conduct of examinations in any way;
16. Not to resort to any type of malpractice, unfair means, or boycott the examinations;
17. It is strictly warned that violation of any one of these norms will result in disciplinary action, including expulsion from the University without any notice.



7. UGC-Fee Refund Policy:

- A) UGC in its 580th meeting held on 15 May 2024, decided and formulated the fee refund policy for the academic session 2024-25.
- B) As per the UGC's Fee Refund Policy for the Academic year 2024-25, Refund of Fee is given as per the following guidelines:
1. Notwithstanding anything contained in any guidelines/prospectus/ notification/ schedule, a full refund of fees shall be made by the HEIs on account of all cancellations of admissions/migrations of students and with a deduction of not more than Rs. 1,000, as a processing fee.
 2. It shall apply to all higher education institutions, whether established or incorporated by or under a Central Act or a State Act, and every institution recognized by the University Grants Commission under clause of Section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and to all institutions deemed to be a University declared as such under Section 3 therein and to all higher education institutions affiliated to a University.
 3. For any admission schedule extending/commencing beyond/after 31 October 2024, the provisions contained in the UGC Notification issued in October 2018 on Refund of Fees and Non-Retention of Original Certificates shall apply (reproduced below for ready reference).

Category	Percentage of Refund of policy	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is received in the HEI
1.	100%	15 days or more before the formally notified last date of admission
2.	90%	Less than 15 days before the formally notified last date of admission
3.	80%	15 days or less after the formally notified last date of admission
4.	50%	30 days or less, but more than 15 days after formally notified last date of admission
5.	00%	More than 30 days after formally notified last date of admission

4. *This policy will remain in force for subsequent academic sessions until the issuance of a revised policy by the UGC.*

(C) Other norms related to Fee refund:

1. Registration fees once paid will not be refunded or readjusted to any other program. The full tuition fee will be refunded if any student cancels his/her admission before the closure of the admission schedule.
2. If any student cancels his/her admission after the commencement of classes, only 75% of the tuition fee of that year will be refunded, even if the student discontinues in the first year or second year, irrespective of whether the student has attended any class or not. However, the students allotted through state-level CETs are exempted from paying 25% tuition fees if any such student opts to join some other institution in the sliding process but before the closure of the last phase of counseling for a particular program, i.e., B.Ed., B.P.Ed., M.B.A., M.C.A./M.C.L.
3. If any student discontinues in the first year, he has to pay 25% of the tuition fee, and if he discontinues in the second year, he has to pay the full fee for the first year and 25% of the second year's tuition fee. If the student discontinues in the third year, he has to pay the full tuition fee for the first and second years and 25% of the third year's tuition fee.
4. If any student discontinues the program and rejoins, in whichever year he/she has to pay the prescribed admission and tuition fees as per the fees prescribed in the prospectus that is in force at the time of rejoining.

8. Refund of Library Caution Deposit:

The caution deposit will be returned to the student after the completion of the course. The caution deposit has to be claimed within one year after the completion of the course; otherwise, the amount paid will not be refunded.

For refund of tuition fees and caution deposit, the students can approach the Dean of Academic Affairs and submit their requisition letter through proper channels.

9. Miscellaneous Provisions:

a) Teaching Staff as Mentors:

It is envisaged to continue the practice of mentorship in departments of Dravidian University. Each faculty member will act as a mentor. They will be entrusted with the responsibility of mentorship, and they will be responsible for monitoring the overall progress of the student in respect of attendance, preparation of projects, etc., and his/her overall participation in the program. Each mentor will be allotted a minimum of 7-8 students from each batch, and he/she will take care of his/her progress and participation in the particular graduate/postgraduate program. Each mentor, besides providing overall guidance, is also responsible for resolving any problems faced by the students.

b) Transitory Provisions:

Whenever a course or scheme of instruction is changed in a particular year, two more examinations immediately following thereafter shall be conducted with the old syllabus/regulations. Candidates not appearing at the examinations or failing them shall take the examinations subsequently according to the changed syllabus/regulations in the equivalent 'course fixed by the respective department announced each year.

10. General Information:

1. The university reserves the right to start or not to start a program/course during the academic year 2025-26.
2. A Minimum of 20 seats are to be filled to run a self- financing programme. Otherwise it shall not be offered.
3. Submission of application and marks/rank in entrance examinations do not guarantee admission.
4. Admission into the university hostels is on a first-come-first-served basis and depends on the availability of accommodation. Students admitted into hostels should pay the hostel bills regularly.
5. Once admitted, the students shall abide by the Dravidian University Conduct rules in force and shall forfeit admission for violating them.
6. Ragging in any form is forbidden, and anyone indulging in it shall be severely punished as per law.
7. The power to sanction Scholarship rests with the government, and the university cannot be held responsible for non-sanctioned delays in receipt of scholarships.

Facilities available on the Campus**1.Hostels for Men and Women:**

- i. There are separate hostels for men and women on the Dravidian University campus. All women students will be provided with accommodation. There is limited accommodation for men students.
- ii. All the students hailing from more than a 20 km radius of Dravidian University are eligible for hostel accommodation. However, admission will be given depending upon the distance between their hometown and the university campus based on the availability of accommodation. The discretion of the university in providing hostel accommodation is final and binding.

2. The eligibility of the candidates is not verified / decided at the time of application and during the entrance test. The verification will be done only during the admissions. Hence, candidates are advised to ensure that they are eligible for the course/subject they are applying for.
3. Candidates should note that the Hall Tickets, Results of Entrance Tests, Rank Cards, Schedules for exercising web based options and certificate verification and other related information will be made available only through websites given above and the candidates can download the same. No personal intimation in this regard will be sent to the candidates either by post or by mail.
4. The candidates will have to appear for the entrance test and for certificate verification (if necessary) on their own expenses.
5. The syllabus for Post Graduate Common Entrance Tests – 2025 (APPGCET-2025) will be made available in the website: <https://cets.apsche.ap.gov.in>
6. The entrance tests in all the subjects (except **M.P.Ed**) will consist of 100 multiple choice objective type questions for 100 marks (one mark each) and is a Computer Based Test (CBT) for 90 minutes duration.
7. M.P.Ed., course admission shall be made based on the marks obtained in the common entrance test (Theory) conducted during APPGCET-2025 and the achievements in sports during their study at Degree (Graduation)/ Post Graduation /B.P.Ed./B.P.E level. The common entrance test (Theory) will be for 100 Marks and weightage of marks for sports achievement will be for 100 marks. The APPGCET-2025 test will be conducted on the syllabus of B.P.Ed./ B.P.E., course. The question paper shall be set with 100 multiple choice questions (MCQs) and is a Computer Based Test (CBT) for 90 minutes duration. Each question carries one mark. The sports achievement certificates (original) will be verified and the marks will be awarded for sports achievement. Hence, the candidates should bring their original sports achievement certificates along with evidence documents like Form-I for Internationals, Form-II for Nationals and Form-III for Inter-University participants etc., on the day informed to the candidates through APPGCET-2025 website later. **The merit list will be prepared basing on the aggregate of 200 marks.**

(2) Admission fee once paid will not be adjusted to any other programme or refunded unless the programme is cancelled by the University.

A. Reservation for SC/ST/BC Categories:

(a) 15% of seats in each course shall be reserved for the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes.



(b) 6% of seats in each course shall be reserved for the candidates belonging to the Scheduled Tribes. These seats reserved for Scheduled Tribes shall be made available to Scheduled Castes and vice versa if qualified candidates are not available in the category. If qualified candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes communities are not available, the leftover seats reserved for them shall be treated as unreserved seats and shall be filled by the candidates of the general pool.

(c) 29% of seats in each course shall be reserved for the candidates belonging to the Backward Classes and shall be allocated among the five groups of Backward Classes as shown below:

GROUP 'A'—7%; GROUP 'B'—10%; GROUP 'C'—1%; GROUP 'D'—7%; GROUP 'E'—4%

If seats for backward classes of a particular group are not available, the leftover seats shall be adjusted for the candidates of the next group. If qualified candidates belonging to Backward Classes are not available to fill up the 29% of seats reserved for them, the leftover seats shall be treated as unreserved and shall be filled up with candidates of the general pool.

No candidate seeking reservation for admission under the above categories will be allowed to participate in the Counselling for admission unless he/she produces the Integrated Community Certificate prescribed by the Govt., and issued by the Revenue Authorities in the government (vide G.O.M. No. 58, Social Welfare (J) Dept., Dated 12-5-1997).

B. Reservation for Women:

(a) **One-third of these seats are reserved for women candidates in each category (i.e., OC, SC, ST, BC, Special Categories, and L/NL). This rule is not applied if women candidates selected on merit in a category from one-third or more of the seats therein. If there are no suitable candidates in a category, these seats will be filled with men candidates of the same category. Absence of an adequate number of women candidates in a category cannot be compensated by giving more seats for women in another category.**

C. Reservation for Economically Weaker Section (EWS):

1.1 Persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs, and OBCs and whose family has a gross annual income below Rs. 8.00 lakh (Rupees eight lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for the benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources, i.e., salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc., for the financial year prior to the year of application.

- i. 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
- ii. Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
- iii. Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;

1. State-level participation in NCC or just 'C or 'B certificate holders. State or inter-university NSS camps or NSS two special camps.

Sports & Games

Participation in the following games and sports only shall be considered under the Games & Sports Category if certified by recognized bodies or associations:

Cricket, football, hockey, volleyball, basketball, tennis, kabaddi, shuttle badminton, ball badminton, table tennis, athletics, swimming, weightlifting, wrestling, boxing, gymnastics, kho-kho, handball, chess, cycling, rowing, bodybuilding, and shooting.

Candidate shall have to produce the following documents:

- i. Certificates issued by a recognized Sports Body or Association.
- ii. Group photos or paper cuttings, if any, as proof of participation of the candidate in the sports or games events. A special categories merit list will be prepared with candidates of Priority I arranged in the order of DUCET rank, followed by candidates of Priority II arranged in the order of DUCET rank, followed by candidates of Priority III arranged in the order of DUCET rank.
- iii. When there is only one special category seat in a course, it will be filled as per the order in the special category merit list.
- iv. When there are two special category seats, the first seat will be filled as per the order in the special category merit list. The second seat will be filled from the special category merit list by a candidate belonging to the category other than the category of the first candidate selected, ensuring women's reservation.
- v. When there are three special category seats, one seat is earmarked for each category. The first seat will be filled as per the order in the special category merit list. The second seat will be filled from the special category merit list by a candidate not belonging to the category of the first candidate selected. The third seat will be filled from the special category merit list by a candidate belonging to the remaining category, ensuring women's reservation. The leftover special category seats will be filled by the general open category.



Differently Abled (DA) Category

- (a) The candidates should enclose the attested copy of the certificate issued by the Medical Board of District Headquarters Hospital or General Hospital of a Medical College. The certificate should indicate the nature and extent of disability in percentage.
- (b) At the time of interview, a differently abled candidate must submit the original DA certificate and appear before the Medical Officer of Dravidian University.
- (c) Admission will be made on the basis of the percentage of disability as assessed by the university doctor, but not according to the rank in the entrance test. Where disability is equal, merit in the entrance test will be taken into consideration for admission.
- (d) A differently abled candidate will not be admitted into a course if the disability does not allow him to pursue the course to a reasonable extent.
- (e) If there is no suitable candidate under DA category, the seat will be filled with a candidate of local open category.

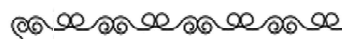
Children of the Armed Personnel (CAP)

The following priorities shall be drawn up with regard to the Children of Armed Personnel.

- i. Children of Service men killed in action.
- ii. Children of Ex-Servicemen disabled in action and permanently incapacitated as a result thereof in respect of disability pension.
- iii. Children of Ex-Servicemen and Service men who have received Gallantry Awards in the following order. (a) Param Vir Chakra; (b) Ashok Chakra; (c) Mahavir Chakra; (d) Kirti Chakra; (e) Vir Chakra; (f) Shaurya Chakra; (g) Sena/Nao Sena/ Vayu Sena Medal; (h) Mention in dispatches.
- iv. Children of Armed Personnel (combatant) irrespective of the rank held by them.
- v. Children of other Ex-Servicemen or Servicemen who are eligible for pension.

Note: The candidates claiming reservation benefits under the above categories shall produce original documents in support of their claim to the Dean of Academic Affairs, and he/she shall be entitled to refer the original documents of the candidates claiming reservation for scrutiny and confirmation to the following authorities.

- i. **NCC-** To the Director of NCC, Andhra Pradesh
- ii. **Sports & Games-** To the Vice-Chairman and Managing Director, Sports Authority of Andhra Pradesh (SAAP)



- ### E. Reservation of seats to students from Other Southern States

The total seats for the M.Ed. course are 50 (inclusive of other states quota of 3 seats, i.e., 1 seat each for Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Kerala). If any of such seats are not filled, they shall be added to the common pool of M.Ed. seats and allotted as per rules of reservation.

- Students belonging to Andhra Pradesh are considered local.
- Students belonging to States of Telangana State, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Kerala and Pondicherry are considered non-locals.

- (a) The open category seats will be filled up with general merit students.
- (b) The SC category seats will be filled up with SC category students.
 - i. If the SC(W) seat is vacant and not filled up, it will be filled by ST(W) only.
 - ii. If no ST(W) candidate is available, it will be filled by SC/ST merit quota.
 - iii. If there is no candidate in the SC category, it will go to the ST category and vice
 - iv. If there is no SC/ST applicant and if the list is exhausted, it will be converted into Open Category (OC).
- (c) Any vacant seat within BC category will be filled up by other BC candidates.
 - i. If BC(W) seats are vacant in any category, they will be filled up by other BC(W) categories.
 - ii. If there are no BC(W) candidates, it will be filled up by BC(Merit) candidates.
 - iii. If the total BC list (in all categories) is exhausted, then the remaining seats will be converted into open category.
